Governor Hickenlooper,


We have been in contact with the Office of the Attorney General in regard to a matter involving the District Attorney of the Twentieth Judicial District. Our October 6, 2014 letter to the Attorney General is attached.

As outlined in our October 6, 2014 letter, we have been advised by the District Attorney of the Twentieth Judicial District that none of the correspondence and communications of his successor, Mary Lacy, are in his custody and control. Furthermore, the District Attorney has refused to provide us the reason for the absence of these records from his custody and control and the identity and location of the person having such custody and control as required by the Colorado Open Records Act.


As stated in our October 6 letter to the Attorney General, we request an investigation regarding violations of Colorado law by the Boulder District Attorney's office.
